# A Strong Start to the Year

The first quarter of 2026 marked a strong and encouraging start for Simbas Footprints. Across our programs, we continued investing in children, young people, women, and communities through education, economic empowerment, and community support. This quarter reflected steady growth, meaningful partnerships, and practical action that responded to community needs. We also advanced important organizational priorities, including early review and analysis for Year Two of our strategic plan, while continuing to build opportunities that respond to the realities and potential of the communities.



# Some of our key highlights include:

- 1 Renovation of a kindergarten classroom to improve the learning environment at *Msandaka Primary School*.
- 2 Establishment of a computer lab at Mji Mpya Secondary School to foster Digital Literacy.
- 3 Distribution of donated supplies received from Crossroads Foundation - Hong Kong to communities in need in Kilimanjaro.
- 4 Continued scholarship support for over 30 students, with some now attending university.
- 5 Hosting the Morgan Cup sports tournament to nurture youth talent through sports.
- 6 Collaboration with Okoa New Generation Organization on sexual and reproductive health education.
- 7 Participation in Mama Hope OC Connect event (Nairobi) and Issroff Family Foundation CLI Convening (Naivasha).
- 8 Partnership with other organizations to host a Women's Day community event.
- 9 Strategic Plan Year Two review meetings to strengthen organizational direction.

### SIMBAS FOOTPRINTS EXPANDS ACCESS TO QUALITY LEARNING FOR OVER 1,400 STUDENTS ACROSS 15 PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN MOSHI.

Our **education programs** focus on expanding access to quality learning opportunities through school partnerships and after-school programs that help students build confidence, creativity, leadership, and life skills. Working with 15 public Schools, Simbas continues to complement formal education with experiences that many students would otherwise not access, including digital learning, creative activities, and health awareness education SRHR.

#### **This quarter:**

- 280 pupils participated in English Club programs
- 315 students received learning materials to support academic success
- Over 150 children participated in arts and creative learning activities.
- The Binti Yetu youth SRHR club reached 882 students
- Computer education continued expanding through new and supported school labs.

Through these efforts, students improved communication skills, confidence, creativity, and exam preparedness.

## ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

Our **economic empowerment initiatives** focus on equipping women and young people with practical skills that create pathways toward self-reliance. Through tailoring, entrepreneurship training, and hands-on skills development, participants continue to build confidence while developing income-generating opportunities that strengthen both families and the local economy

### This quarter:

- 31 participants enrolled in the tailoring program
- 29 participants completed additional training in soap making, batik, and petroleum jelly production
- Participants engaged in market opportunities to sell their products
- A new tailoring cohort was successfully welcomed. These programs continue to build confidence, entrepreneurship skills, and pathways toward financial independence.

### This quarter:

- 28 sponsored children received school supplies and support to remain in school
- Home visits were conducted to strengthen family engagement and partnerships helped secure education sponsorship and disability support for families
