Overview of damages caused, immediate needs and actions performed

	Area	Damages	Immediate Needs	Actions Performed
Mjimpya Ward	Resources	Floods have submerged farmlands, leading to the destruction of crops and soil erosion. Food reserves have been swept away, resulting in food shortages while domestic animals and birds, which are kept as a source of income, are lost.	Food and water supplies, clothing, and essential household items.	Distribution of food packages to 109 households.
	Vulnerable Population	Children, elders, and people with disabilities are facing increased health risks and lack of access to essential services. Some families have completely lost their homes and are now living in temporary shelters with inadequate facilities.	Special care and support for children, elders, and people with disabilities. Provision of temporary shelters with adequate facilities.	Over 100 students from Langoni Primary School and Mjimpya Secondary School received essential school supplies such as uniforms, shoes, exercise books, pens, and pencils.
	Health	Contaminated water sources have led to an increase in diseases such as cholera and dysentery. Malnutrition results from food shortage.	Hygiene and medical supplies to prevent and treat waterborne diseases.	Distribution of bed packs, liquid and bar soaps to 109 households.
	Infrastructure	Several roads and bridges have been washed away or damaged, hampering transportation and communication. Electrical grids and damage to the water and sanitation infrastructure have increased the risk of waterborne diseases.	Rebuilding roads, restoring electricity and water supply systems, and repairing sanitation facilities.	By government
Simbas Community Center	Infrastructure	Key infrastructures like our office buildings, playing grounds, chicken and animal keeping coops, electricity, water, and sanitation systems, have been damaged.	Renovation of infrastructure	Intensive office renovations are still on progress, including mud removal, repairing water and sanitation systems, renovating chicken coops, and installing storage boards to restore functionality.
	Resources	Essential resources including office documents, computers, musical instruments, games and tailoring products have been destroyed or misplaced.	Replacement of resources lost	Progressing
